This will be the first public performance by Wimbledon Choral since Christmas 2019, and what greater way to celebrate than with Mozart's glorious *Mass in C Minor*, widely regarded as his masterpiece in the field of religious composition. This monumental work, scored for two soprano soloists, a tenor and a bass, double chorus and large orchestra, remained unfinished, and became known as the 'Great Mass'. With dramatic choral writing and wonderful solo scoring, this formidable work is studded with gems from operatic skill to Baroque counterpoint.

Roxanna Panufnik's *Letters from Burma*, composed in 2004, was inspired by Aung San Suu Kyi's vivid description of life in Myanmar while under house arrest. Panufnik's use of traditional Burmese folk music makes this moving work all the more poignant by the recent Rohingya refugee crisis.

Benjamin Britten's *Serenade for Tenor, Horn and Strings* offers a contemplation of night and sleep through the poetry of Keats, Jonson, Blake and Tennyson.

Widely considered one of the finest choruses in London, Wimbledon Choral is delighted to be returning to Cadogan Hall for a concert that promises to both uplift and move in equal measure.
